

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY Fifth Sunday of Easter

Almighty God, whom truly to know is everlasting life: Grant us so perfectly to know your Son Jesus Christ to be the way, the truth, and the life, that we may steadfastly follow his steps in the way that leads to eternal life; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

A LESSON FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

Lessons from the Acts of the Apostles replace our typical Old Testament lessons during the season of Easter because Acts records the events of the earliest days of the Church following Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension.

Reader A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

8:26-40

Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go towards the south - to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷ So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸ and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹ Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰ So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹ He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³² Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

- "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth.
- ³³ In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" ³⁸He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

A LESSON FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT EPISTLES

Reader A reading from the first letter of St. John.

4:7-21

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. ⁹ God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. ¹⁰ In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

¹³ By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴ And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Saviour of the world. ¹⁵ God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. ¹⁶ So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. ¹⁷ Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgement, because as he is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸ There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ Those who say, "I love God", and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. ²¹ The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

15:1-8

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. ² He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes[±] to make it bear more fruit. ³ You have already been cleansed- by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴ Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷ If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

THE MINISTRATION OF COMMUNION

All baptized Christians, no matter your Christian affiliation, are welcome to receive communion (Holy Eucharist) at Calvary.

Both the host (bread) and wine (in a chalice) will be offered. You may choose to partake in one or both kinds.

The doctrine of 'concomitance' teaches that the full presence of Christ is present in every particle of both the bread and wine. Otherwise, it would mean that if one receives more bread or wine (or more of both, as the priest usually does) one would receive more of the Lord, which is clearly not the case. Regardless of whether we receive a large or small amount, in one kind or in both, one always receives the fullness of the Sacrament.

"What if I'm not baptized or don't feel comfortable receiving communion?"

Those not partaking in communion for any reason are most welcome to come forward to the altar rail to receive a blessing from the priest. You can indicate to the priest that you are not receiving communion but desire a blessing by crossing your arms in the shape of an "X" across your chest.



"How We Got the Bible?"

This week we are continuing the topics of Session 2 where you will learn things like:

- A pastor's kid who chopped the Old Testament out of his Bible, and why we really need the Old Testament.
- The languages that the Old Testament was both written and translated in.
- The Dead Sea Scrolls
- Why some Old Testaments have certain books that others don't.

Have you ever wondered who wrote the books in the Bible and how they ended up together? Has anyone ever told you that some books were cut out of the Bible or that the stories of Jesus in the Gospels can't be trusted? In this class we are going to dive into the fascinating account of the most amazing and best-preserved book the world has ever seen. Dr. Timothy Paul Jones, in the video portions of our class, will give easy-to-understand answers to popular questions on the Bible's reliability and accuracy.

The Six Sessions for the whole course are:

- 1) What's So Special about the Bible?
- 2) How We Got the Old Testament
- 3) How We Got the New Testament
- 4) How the Books of the New Testament Were Chosen
- 5) How the New Testament Was Copied
- 6) How We Got the Bible in English

Each class will be a mixture of a video presentation, elaboration from Fr. Gabriel, and group discussion.


An email was sent out to the congregation with links to purchase the books and resources for the class.


